Droving on stock routes



Central Highlands Regional Council is not LPA accredited and cannot meet LPA requirements.

LIVESTOCK IDENTIFICATION

- Prior to arriving, email or message photos of the livestock you attend to drove to your council ranger.
- Photos need to include the brand and the overall herd for identification purposes.
- The person in charge of the travelling stock must complete the transfer of NLIS devices within 48 hours of moving stock onto the stock route network.

CHRC PIC QICX8000

- The permit holder must submit confirmation of NLIS transfer to the council ranger and state:
 - number of devices transferred
 - date of transfer
 - transaction number.

LIVESTOCK HEALTH

- You must supply a health declaration and NVD with livestock when they arrive and/ or when droving commences.

- If livestock come from a tick free area, they **must** be treated with Combavac 3 in 1 or 3 germ vaccine a month prior to arrival into the Central Highlands Regional Council area.
- Should an animal be unable to travel the required distance as stated on the permit, you must remove the animal from the mob and seek alternate arrangements for its welfare.



FENCING RULES

- No fencing shall be constructed across any public roadway or property access.
- No fencing shall be attached to road furniture.

WATER REQUIREMENTS

- A water truck and trough large enough to water all livestock **must** accompany the herd for the duration of the permit at all times.
