1	Open meeting	RLO introduced attendees.
	Welcome and Apologies	Councillor Gai Sypher welcomed attendees and apologies were noted.



2	Confirmation of previous meeting minutes	 Amendment requests to RADF 2019-2020 Round 3 minutes were noted: P3 Miners Common, Arts and Cultural Centre Inc. application (training venue to be confirmed) to indicate main concern was the absence of letters of support for the project. P4 Blackwater Patchwork is a group application not a Council Initiated Project (CIP). P5 Project amendments - Art Trail booklet was a change of project to website. The website will have a small supporting booklet. The project is ongoing into 2020-2021 FY.
3	Actions from previous meeting	An Action table update was provided by RLO. Background to projects was provided for new members. Two RADF 2019-2020 Round 3 approved applications, to the value of \$1 653 could not proceed due to COVID-19 restrictions. Funds allocated to these project have been returned to the RADF 2019-2020 budget.
4	Round 4 applications and assessment discussion	 RADF assessment discussion: Concerns were raised surrounding COVID-19 impacts to project delivery of applications. It was noted that applications can require a timeframe amendment for a number of reasons and that this in not uncommon. When this occurs, applicants seek approval from the CHACAC. Templates to assist application assessment were discussed. It was noted that 'Assessment Criteria' have been trailed several times and these don't work effectively due to variables in art projects. Noted that CHRC's RADF guidelines are the overarching assessment guide. The RADF application form was discussed. It was decided that percentages need to be removed from the application forms. Forms are to be reformatted to become online editable documents. A generic application template was sought. It was advised the RADF program previously had a general template. This has changed to an individual model which varies from council to council. Action: RLO to remove percentages and action a service ticket request to reformat RADF application forms to become online editable documents. Individual applications - (1 application) Lachlan Grierson - Blacksmithing workshops Lachlan Grierson to attend professional development blacksmithing workshops at Cobb and Co. Museum. Background to the application and current delays in the COVID-19 environment were discussed.



- Cobb and Co. Museum conduct regular workshops in this medium.
- Lachlan Grierson will attend at a suitable time in the future. Once trained, he will offer Blacksmithing training back in the local community.
- Due to budget constraints this project is requested to be resubmitted in Round 1, 2020-2021.

- It was suggested that the project may encompass too much. It was decided the Youth element should become a separate CIP project.
- Members were all in favour of splitting the application to define the two project areas within the initial project proposal:
 - 1. Artist development and mentoring project.
 - 2. Youth project.
