Galleries and upcoming exhibitions Emerald Art Gallery

- Current exhibition: Camille Swallow "Feel my footprints" on display until 17 June 2022. Mayor Kerry Hayes opened the exhibition on 6 May with 30 people attending the opening. Camille had a great night and it was a really lovely experience for her as an emerging artist.
- Entries for the CHRC Youth Awards close next Friday 3 June 2022 at 5pm. The opening and awards presentation will be held at the Emerald Art Gallery on Friday 24 June 2022 at 6pm, opened by Mayor Kerry Hayes and Awards presented by Judge Kim Eadie. The Youth exhibition will be open until 27 July 2022. People's Choice award will be decided via public vote on the Have Your Say, Central Highlands (HYSCH) platform. Voting will be open from opening night until 8 July 2022, and the winner will be announced via social media on 10 July 2022.
- Entries are open for the CHRC Annual Art Awards Emerald. Entries close on Friday 15 July 2022. The
 opening night and awards presentation will be held on Friday 5 August 2022 at 6pm. The Emerald Art
 Award Exhibition will be on display until 16 September 2022. People's choice voting will be decided via
 public vote on HYSCH. Voting will be open from opening night until 21 August 2022, and the winner will be
 announced via social media on 23 August 2022.

Bauhinia Bicentennial Art Gallery

- Currently on display in Springsure is the Blackwater Art Society's (BAS) exhibition "Through our Eyes". The
 opening for their exhibition will be next Friday 3 June at 6pm. The exhibition will be on display until 8 July
 2022.
- Appearing in the gallery after the BAS exhibit will be Natasha Stanton with her first ever solo exhibition "Emergence". Natasha's exhibition will be on display from 16 July until 3 September 2022 and opening night will be 15 July 2022 at 6pm.



 After Natasha's exhibition we will see Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Springsure school back in the gallery from 11 September until 15 October 2022.

Our Collection Matters project


- Dates have been set for Emerald and Springsure workshops
 - o Springsure: 20-25 June 2022
 - o Emerald: 11-16 July 2022
- Organising sessions in Duaringa has been a challenge as Carol Finger has left town and there is limited interest from other parties. Cr Sypher will reach out to historical groups and potentially interested parties in Bluff and Dingo to see if they are interested in progressing the project.
- Staff from the tourism information centres will also be invited to participate in the workshops.

6. Creative Cultural Futures and Heritage Action Plan 2022-24 FYs

The current Creative Cultural Futures and Heritage Action Plan (CCFHAP) 2022-2024 FYs is due to expire on 30 June 2022, so a new action plan has been drafted to span 2022-2024 FYs. This will be presented to council on 15 June 2022. The draft actions were circulated to the group for feedback. The following feedback was discussed:

- It was noted that this plan has an increased number of actions from the last action plan as each goal has a unique action rather than referring back to other sections of the plan.
- Dingo History Room members enquired whether the works in the previous action plan have been completed. MCC confirmed that they have, and therefore do not need to be included in this new plan.
- Capella Cultural Centre hanging tracks members requested further detail about this project. CAE clarified
 that this was raised during the repainting of the building. Information on the state of current tracks is being
 sought to be able to progress with replacement in the new financial year. Cr Sypher offered to inspect the
 current tracks and share information with the Arts and Culture team. CAE will then progress with the
 Coordinator Community Facilities.
- Preservation and conservation for heritage buildings on council land members discussed the value in creating conservation plans for heritage building across the region. This will be considered during the development of a heritage strategy, per the proposed draft Corporate Plan 2022-2027.
- Galleries volunteer program clarification was sought regarding the format of the group and if it will be incorporated or managed by the ACOG. CAE clarified that it will be a working group managed by the ACOG.
- Lone Grave Register all library officers are equipped to add to lone graves to the register and can share the information with community upon request. The register is currently not linked to the library catalogue. A future goal would be for the register to be a published and be publicly accessible.





Local and family history – members raised the importance of this work and noted that some of the
custodians of this historical knowledge are ageing and therefore sadly may not be with us much longer.
History call out days act as a catalyst for collection of information and stories from across the region,
however there is an extensive process for these to be made available to the public. Current staff are at full
capacity, therefore for this work to progress additional staff may be required. Cr Sypher suggested that she,
Cr Brimblecombe and Cr Burns could advocate for additional staffing to be considered in future years.

7. Arts Around August 2022

Arts around August planning is well underway with a media release calling for community event submissions being published Thursday 26 May 2022. This was accompanied by updates to the council website and a new registration form for activities that feeds directly into a spreadsheet that can be easily reformatted into a calendar view.

Submissions will be compiled, and the program calendar launched in late June 2022. This will be followed by weekly posts on Facebook listing upcoming events for the week and referring back to the council website for the full program. Discussions are also underway to determine the best way to display event information on the Central Queensland Highlands What's On calendar. Further promotion will be via pull-up banners, posters and flyers with a QR code directing to the website and updated calendar, and radio advertising is being considered.

To assist in the planning of Arts around August, a number of activity options were compiled and circulated to the group. The following was discussed in relation the options presented:

- Budget available \$3,500 remaining in this FY / \$8,000 requested next FY
- Melly Melody performances were considered risky given the cost and limited success in selling tickets to
 events in recent times. Members agreed this option should not be pursued.
- Quirky Wire Art Raelene Bock's workshops are always well received. This was determined to be a priority activity. The program proposed includes two days of workshops in Emerald, and one day each in Tieri,



- Dingo and Rolleston. Travel and tutor time would be covered by funding, with materials to be funded by participants through ticket fees. Members supported progressing this activity.
- Emerald Arts Precinct Open Day Cr Sypher shared her vision for the open day. The aim is for this event to be an opportunity for local artists and groups to showcase what they do. This will be a demonstration event not a 'come and try' day. Members suggested a Saturday when the library is open for additional activities. Saturday 30 July 2022 was proposed as date, so as not to clash with the Annual Art Awards Emerald and the Sapphire Jewel of the Outback events in early August 2022. As this is a council event, all artists and activities would be covered by council's public liability insurance. A local community group will be approached to run a sausage sizzle on the day. Local acoustic artists will also be contacted to perform at the event. Members supported progressing this activity.
- Wild Craft Workshops members agreed that local tutors should be prioritised over bringing in tutors from outside the region. Members agreed Wild Craft workshops should not be pursued, and suggested other local artists should be contacted to run candle making and jewellery making workshops.
- Schoolhouse Quilters as the group self-funds, it would be reasonable that hosting groups would provide
 morning tea and participants pay for their own materials. Members supported this activity, noting that no
 further support from council is required.
- International Year of Glass initially workshops additional to the approved RADF project were suggested.
 However, due to the change of dates for the RADF project, there is no need for additional workshops as they will already fall within the Arts around August program.
- Scrapmetalsheila Milynda Rogers has offered September 2022 dates to reschedule the workshops that
 were intended for Metal in March 2022. Central Queensland University are not able to hire their facility for
 hot works. Members suggest that Marist College has facilities that could be investigated. It was noted that
 other workshops by Milynda in Clermont charged a reasonable fee for a simpler barbed wire workshop.
 Members supported progressing this activity.
- Bric Nic Nicole Mittan is intending to run a series of Lego workshops over the coming months and during
 the September 2022 school holidays. The committee agreed that funding Nicole to travel to other towns
 would increase access to these popular workshops. Regular ticket costs would still be funded by
 participants. Priority towns were identified to be Blackwater, Springsure, Tieri, Dingo. Members supported
 progressing this activity.

Action: Arts and Culture team to progress supported Arts around August activities including; Quirky Wire workshops, Emerald Arts Precinct Open Day, finding local artists to run candle and jewellery making workshops, Scrapmetalsheila workshops, and the Bric Nic workshops.

8.	RADF 2022-23	 Regional Arts Development Fund 2022-23 Rather than the full application process, Arts Queensland will be issuing variations to 2021-22 contracts that offer the same amount of funding for the 2022-23 program. Council have been offered the same amount of \$39,500. Tentative dates as circulated for three rounds were considered and members supported the dates, pending confirmation of 2023 council meeting dates. The dates were aligned with key points in the year, being Round 1 – after Arts around August but not too close to end of year Round 2 – after school resumes so volunteers have time to coordinate after the January break Round 3 – as close as feasible to end of financial year so that activities can be organised in advance for Arts around August A summary of previous grant applications was shared with the committee, which detailed the different categories of applications and percentages of funding allocated to each category Members noted that there has been a decrease in individual applications. This could be due to lack of professional development opportunities being available, or a lack of awareness of the opportunity. CAE agreed to take this into consideration for future promotion of the program so that the individual category is highlighted. Members discussed the types of CIPs that have been submitted in the past and what type should be submitted going forward. CIPs should be in response to community feedback or request, or a way to progress more expensive projects that otherwise might be inaccessible to a community group. Members reaffirmed commitment to critically reviewing all applications and openly sharing thoughts and feedback during assessment discussions. Members agreed that in circumstances where council officers may be unsure about the appropriateness of a CIP, that officers may request validation from CHACAC members prior to investing too much



	applications more accessible to community groups, so that more community-driven projects can avail the funding opportunity.
